

An Experience That Eclipses All Others

Within a day's drive for 25% of the entire North American population is the ultimate viewing experience for the 2024 total solar eclipse. Lying directly within the path of eclipse totality is the Olympic Region of Lake Placid, Whiteface Mountain (among the highest peaks in the Adirondack Mountains), and Gore Mountain (the most expansive ski area in the Northeast), all offering well-organized solar eclipse viewing party in New York State.

Whisk up to an elevation of 3,646 feet via an enclosed eight-passenger gondola on which telescopes and camera equipment is easily transported. There on the summit of Little Whiteface Mountain passengers can easily walk onto a large viewing deck. On skis or a snowboard via a quad lift, one can go even higher (4,386 feet) on this mountain widely known for the greatest vertical east of the Rockies. This once-in-a-lifetime eclipse experience is made even more remarkable with the longest totality time of any accessible mountain in the East and an optimal south facing view.

Just imagine this extraordinary window of time perfectly framed by breathtaking vistas of one of the most beautiful and wild regions of the country. Adding to it all, the nearby Olympic Village of Lake Placid – home to the Miracle on Ice – is a genuinely captivating travel destination any time of year. A truly magical eclipse experience all comes together here with the highest organized viewing party and the longest period of totality to create an unforgettable astrological adventure.
